# Discover the amazing women and people of color celebrated in statues around our country!

Did you know the U.S. Capitol building has a collection of one hundred statues? Each state selects two prominent historical figures to represent it as statues in Washington, D.C. Who is chosen to tell the stories of our nation? How and why are they chosen? This book introduces some of the women and people of color with statues at the Capitol and around the country, and considers the timely question: Who needs a statue?

**Eve LaPlante** is the author of *Marmee & Louisa, American Jezebel, Seized,* and *Salem Witch Judge,* winner of the Massachusetts Book Award. She has degrees from Princeton and Harvard. *Who Needs a Statue?* is her first book for children.

**Margy Burns Knight** is a children's book author and educator. She received the National Education Association's Author Illustrator Human and Civil Rights Award and is a Peace Corps Veteran. She lives in Maine, where she serves on the board of her local library and coordinates *Let's Talk*, a conversational English class for resettled refugees.

Alix Delinois iis a fine artist and art teacher living in Harlem, New York. He was born in Saint Marc, Haiti, and moved to Harlem as a child. His formal training began at fourteen when he was selected to the City College Arts Institute for inner city students. He went on to the High School of Art and Design, the Fashion Institute of Technology, and Pratt Institute. In addition to his art training, Delinois holds a Master's in Art Education from Brooklyn College. Alix's work displays dynamic color palette and bold compositions to express human emotions and experience. He has illustrated multiple children's books, including two by award-winning authors Walter Dean Myers and Edwidge Danticat..




# A timely and charming reminder of the joys found in engaging with community.

When Nadine asks a new friend if she has a coming-here story too, she topples the first domino in a communitywide chain of neighbors and new friends listening to those around them, wondering about their perspectives, and finally asking thoughtful, curious questions. This lyrical, pay-it-forward story encourages readers to engage with those around them, seeing each similarity and difference as part of the colorful landscape of community.

Elly Berke has always loved children's literature and the power of asking good questions. Her earliest influence was Barbara Cooney whom she met in 1991 at a book signing in Damariscotta, Maine. The characters in this story are inspired by people she has met on her professional journey through public education: leading programs at New York City's Tenement Museum, teaching ESL in bilingual schools, and studying Arts in Education at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Outside of writing and teaching, she is a professional actor involved in many projects around her local Somerville, MA and virtually through her home voice over studio.

Luciana Navarro Powell has created art since childhood and became a full-time illustrator in 2001. She moved from watercolor and acrylic paints to the digital brush-loving the freedom and the possibilities of experimentation with textures—and then to mixed media, incorporating photographs and scanned objects with traditional techniques in a digital melting pot. The colors, vibrancy, and warmth of her native Brazil infuse her work with a sunny optimism, humor, and warm human-animal-landscape interactions. As an immigrant, she makes sure that kids can see themselves in her art.







# Ensure America's first Black female doctor is not forgotten again.

We should all know the name Dr. Rebecca Lee Crumpler, but you probably don't--or at least, you don't yet. *Finding Rebecca* examines the surprising disappearance of America's first Black female doctor from records and memory. But the search for her story and her final resting place, more than one hundred years after her death, turned up a few murky details that author Shani King uses to piece together a picture of the life she led, her hardships, and her many accomplishments. Young readers will discover more about this trailblazing first—and help ensure that she is lost no longer.

Shani Mahiri King is Vice Dean, Martha L. Minow Scholar, and a Professor of Law at Rutgers Law School. Shani is the father of two, for whom he wrote the picture books *Have I Ever Told You*? and *Have I Ever Told You Black Lives Matter*? He lives with his amazing wife, two wonderful kids, two untrained dogs, and two lovable cats in New Jersey.

Nicole Tadgell is an award-winning watercolor artist whose work spans more than thirty picture books for children. Born in Detroit, Michigan, Nicole was a shy child whose family moved frequently and art was an escape for her[em dash] especially in new schools where she was the only Black kid in class. Today, Nicole continues to bring stories to life while advocating for diversity in children's literature. In addition to her artwork, she visits schools and conducts lectures and workshops[em dash]and finds beauty, strength and solace in the practice of tai chi. Nicole lives in Chesapeake, Virginia.








# A stunning Christmas classic from Dahlov Ipcar—back to charm today's readers.

With vivid imagination and vibrant colors, acclaimed artist Dahlov Ipcar presents a stunning holiday scene. From one shining star that graces the top of an evergreen, she envisions a parade of wild creatures that come to visit: young black bears and snowy owls, evening grosbeaks and happy chipmunks. *My Wonderful Christmas Tree* by the legendary Dahlov Ipcar is a holiday classic that captures the Christmas spirit as we find it in nature.

Born in 1917, artist **Dahlov Ipcar** was raised in New York City during the early American Modernist movement. Her parents, Marguerite and William Zorach, were prominent artists of the time, and Dahlov was brought up with a strong artistic sense. She illustrated her first picture book, *The Little Fisherman* by Margaret Wise Brown, in 1945 and went on to publish more than thirty celebrated children's and young adult books. Dahlov's unique style, featuring bold colors and graphic elements, has an enduring quality that continues to en-gage young readers. She believed that fine art in children's books was "the best way to bring the creative imagination of the artist to the largest number of children." Dahlov Ipcar died in 2017 at the age of 99 and had painted almost every day of her life.

From zooplankton to phytoplankton, these small-scale superheroes are the foundation of the ocean's food chain, keep our climate in check, generate up to fifty percent of the oxygen produced on the planet each year—and much more. Stunning microscopic photos and primary source research provide a seldom seen look at these dynamic drifters. "Science interpreter," Mary Cerullo, dives into the wet world of plankton, and takes a deep look at the good and the bad, the tiny and even tinier. Readers will discover even the smallest actors can make a big difference. Glossary and informative sidebars included.

**Mary Cerullo** describes herself as a science interpreter. She works with scientists and ocean advocates to explain scientific research and environmental issues to the public, with the goal of motivating others to protect the ocean. At times she has literally immersed herself in her work, diving among sharks in the Bahamas, studying dolphin behavior at the Dolphin Research Center in Florida, and exploring the connection between volcanoes and the ocean on the island of Hawaii. Mary has written more than twenty award-winning books about the ocean for children. She has worked with kids, teachers, and other ocean lovers for more than forty years, from her first job at the New England Aquarium in Boston, to two decades with Friends of Casco Bay, an environmental advocacy organization in South Portland, Maine.




A dangerous expedition to Antartica's Danger Islands leads to the discovery of one of the world's largest penguin supercolonies!

When scientist Heather Lynch came across a satellite image of the remote Danger Islands of the Antarctic Peninsula showing an enormous pink swath of land, she knew exactly what she was looking at. Poop-or guano to be more specific. She also knew who it was from (penguins), how many there were (a lot!), and what they were eating (krill). With the deadline for proposing boundaries for protected lands in Antarctica fast approaching, Heather built a team for a dangerous expedition to the Danger Islands. Their mission was to count the members of the colony, determine how long they had been established there, and make a case for protecting this land too. Penguin populations are particularly important. As indicator species, they can alert scientists to larger environmental issues. Join Heather and her team on a fascinating exploration of these remote islands as they discover one of the world's largest penguin supercolonies. Includes team photos from the expedition!

Helen Taylor writes books that inspire kids to wonder about their world in new ways. Her favorite questions are the simple "how?" and "why?"—even though the answers are rarely simple. She hopes her books make science and engineering fun and accessible for kids. Besides writing, she enjoys traveling, baking, and searching for banana slugs in the redwoods near her home in Santa Cruz, California.







She lives in Hawaii.





And when danger looms, perhaps they are not as old or as brave as they think they are. Dahlov Ipcar's incomparable signature artwork has never looked bolder or brighter.

**Dahlov Ipcar** was born in Vermont, raised in Greenwich Village, and summered in Maine after her parents (the famed sculptor William Zorach and artist Marguerite Zorach) bought a farm there in 1923. Dahlov moved from New York City to the farm with her husband in 1937. Her children's book career began in the early 1940s, when she illustrated *The Little Fisherman* by Margaret Wise Brown. This charming title helped launch a four-decade run that saw her write and illustrate more than thirty children's books of her own. Today, her artwork is known worldwide. Dahlov Ipcar kept creating until her death in 2017, at age 99.



Oksana has a PhD in Education and has taught children's literature at the University of Georgia and served as a children's literature consultant and a creative curator. Oksana lives in Pennsylvania.

**Kateryna Stepanishcheva** is a Ukrainian illustrator and textile designer. She has illustrated a number of children's books and dozens of pieces for various children's magazines for international markets. She adores Ukrainian calligraphy and linocut and lives in Kyiv, Ukraine.


**Ben Rothery** is a detail-obsessed illustrator from Norwich, England, via Cape Town. He combines multiple processes to create intricate and delicate illustrations and repeating patterns, full of fine detail and vibrant color. Much of Ben's work is inspired or informed by his love of nature—he grew up wanting variously to be a shark, a dinosaur or David Attenborough crossed with Indiana Jones, but settled on illustration as a way to bring those fantasies to life on paper. This charming title helped launch a four-decade run that saw her write and illustrate more than thirty children's books of her own. Today, her artwork is known worldwide. Dahlov Ipcar kept creating until her death in 2017, at age 99.

**Carl Little** is the author of many art books, including *Edward Hopper's New England, The Watercolors of John Singer Sargent, The Art of Francis Hamabe*, and *The Art of Dahlov Ipcar*. His poetry has appeared in the *Paris Review, Off the Coast, Hudson Review, Words & Images*, and other journals and anthologies.



His edition of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* won a National Book Award in 1983. His *Jump, Again! The Further Adventures of Brer Rabbit* was included in *The New York Times* "Ten Best Illustrated Children's Books" of 1987. He is Professor of Art at Smith College.





Did you know that the white material on the outside of space shuttles was not metal or glass but actually fabric? Specialized quilts, two inches thick, covered the space shuttles and protected the astronauts from deadly heat and radiation. Jean Wright was one of the eighteen "Sew Sisters" who crafted these thermal blankets, mostly by hand, with incredible precision and skill. Capturing both the grandeur of space flight and the intimacy of a needle and thread, *Sew Sister* tells the story of Jean's childhood passion for space and sewing, and her fascinating work for NASA's shuttle program.

Elise Matich's elegant prose and stunning, detailed artwork harmonize with the STEAM concept at the heart of this story: the role of skilled hands and artistry in STEM fields like aeronautics. *Sew Sister* offers a heroine in the context of space exploration who doesn't go to college or excel at math; instead, it is her excellence in a trade—one traditionally practiced by women—that allows her to achieve her dream. NASA's space shuttle fleet was retired in 2011.

**Elise Matich** (Alexandria, VA) is an educator, artist, writer, and mother. *Sew Sister* is the first in a series of picture book biographies she is working on that explore the lives of figures who have been overlooked or overshadowed in their fields.



# A timely story of kids pushing back against book banning and supporting their immigrant classmates.

Kanzi, the immigrant girl of Aya Khalil and Anait Semirdzhyan's bestselling picture book *The Arabic Quilt*, has come to feel welcome in her American school—that is, until an entire shelf of books about immigrant kids and kids of color suddenly disappears from the school library. Upon learning that books with kids who look like her have been banned by her school district, Kanzi is overcome by confusion and fear. But her classmates support her, and together with their teacher's help—they hatch a plan to hold a bake sale and use the proceeds to buy diverse books for libraries. The event is a big success; the entire


school participates, and the local TV station covers it in the evening news. Prodded by her classmates to read the poem she has written, Kanzi starts softly but finds her voice. "You have banned important books, but you can't ban my words," she reads. "Books are for everyone." The crowd chants, "No banned books! No banned books!" and the next week, the ban is reversed.

The backmatter includes a recipe for baklawa, the Egyptian pastry that Kanzi prepares for the bake sale.

Director Steven Spielbug tries to keep the cast of characters on task, but it's worse than herding cats: The orb-weaving spider would like to eat one or two other actors; the grasshopper is a diva; the worm is too busy munching dirt to emerge from the ground on cue; the robin has called in sick and fails to show up for the predation scene; and the slug

is too embarrassed by his slime to perform. Then filming is interrupted by a wuffling noise and a foul-smelling hurricane as Fido the dog sniffs his way through the grass and onto the set. The panicked actors flee at top speed (which is not very fast in the slug's case), but the intrepid Antenborough continues narrating, Spielbug keeps directing, and they bring the film to a dramatic conclusion. Despite the chaos—or maybe because of it—we learn some things about these animals, and the backmatter gives more nature facts. But the main object is pure fun.

Fun is the order of the day, but an unobtrusive banner on each page lets interested readers know which figure of speech is being featured. This is a book a young reader and future writer can grow with.



Owen's family has planted native shrubs, trees, and perennials around their house, providing food and habitat for the birds Owen loves. He hopes to see a rare Cerulean warbler-perhaps the same one that visited last year.

In early April, as Owen and his sister search the hickories, oaks, and dogwoods for returning birds, a huge group of birds leaves the misty mountain slopes of the Yucatan peninsula for the 600-mile flight across the Gulf of Mexico to their summer nesting grounds. One of them is a Cerulean warbler. He will lose more than half his body weight even if the journey goes well. Aloft over the vast ocean, the birds encourage each other with squeaky chirps that say, "We are still alive. We can do this."

Owen's family watches televised reports of a great storm over the Gulf of Mexico, fearing what it may mean for migrating songbirds. In alternating spreads, we wait and hope with Owen, then struggle through the storm with the warbler.
